HEALTH RESORTS: Bad Kissingen 1928; 1980 and 1981

BAD KISSINGEN 1928

Capablanca had lost the world championship in 1927. He returned to tournament chess during the next year. His successor Alekhine avoided him... The other chess stars took part in Bad Kissingen from 12 until 25 ix 1928. They played in the Regentenbau.

Efim Bogoljubow won the tournament by playing well and capturing blundered pieces. Capablanca became second after a poor start. The amateur world champion Euwe competed with the best players at an equal level. Rubinstein had a great finish.



Bad Kissingen held two further international invitation tournaments:

1980 Karpov won in a Quadrangular, above 2./3. Spassky and Hübner, and 4. Unzicker 1981 Korchnoi won at 9/10, full three points above joint Seirawan and Hort, six players

BAD KISSINGEN 1983 Match

In 1983, Bad Kissingen organized the FIDE Candidate's quarter-final match between Viktor Korchnoi and Lajos Portisch:

Korchnoi, aged 52, won easily with 6-3, winning already three of the four first games.
